

FoCo Book Festival RETURNS WITH WRITERS AND ROCK STARS

After a successful inaugural event in 2016, the Fort Collins Book Fest returns October 21 with Writings and Riffs, a theme focusing on books, poetry and music as a way of storytelling, self-expression and conversation.

Headlining the 2017 book festival is Kim Gordon, Sonic Youth musician, artist and author of the New York Times bestselling memoir Girl in a Band.

She is joined by other noted music authors like Colorado's own music historian G. Brown (Red Rocks: The Concert Year's); author and Rolling Stone Magazine contributor Steve Knopper (MJ: The Genius of Michael Jackson); and cultural historian Craig Werner, a Rock and Roll Hall of Fame nominating committee member (forthcoming book For What It's Worth: A New History of the Sixties).

> "Each year's Book Fest theme seeks to showcase the intersection of the community's books and literary circles with our cultural heritage, industries and social interests," says Anne Macdonald, festival co-founder and librarian at Poudre River Public Library District. "Last year, we focused on craft brewing; this year, we spotlight the role of music in our community."

Festival attendees will experience a variety of authors and interesting topics. More than 30 authors will participate in the free day-long event with sessions ranging from readings by local writers and Fort Collins Poet Laureates to the featured panel discussion "The Remix: The Books that Made Me" and from presentations like "History vs. Hamilton" with Rick Beyer to discussions about "Ecomusicology" with Mark Pedelty.

Festival goers can attend panel discussions, writing workshops, author reading, book signings and other sessions throughout the day and engage with a variety of writers and musicians.

Pre-festival highlights include music performances by the Elvis Experience at Harmony Library's "History Comes Alive"; a vinyl exchange event; and "Liner Notes," a special, limited-time Book Fest Brew from Intersect Brewing.

The FoCo Book Fest is presented by the Poudre River

Public Library District in partnership with Colorado State University Morgan Library and the City of Fort Collins Fort Fund. It takes place at a variety of venues throughout Old Town Fort Collins from 9am-9pm on Saturday, October 21.





"All the stuff that was going on with women in the media and sexual harassment and sexual assault, I thought th the humor," she said.

Within the book, Queen is clear about who the celebrities are and what exactly happened.

"(Readers) may see it as women have been talking about this forever, so you better do well to listen," she said.

Queen will be involved in three events, "Social Vibes: A Sign of the Times," at noon, "Poetry Lounge" at 3 p.m., l

House, 316 Willow St., and "The Remix: Books that Made Me," at 5 p.m. at Block One Events, 428 Linden St.

"I think music is a powerful venue for saying things that are not necessarily accepted in everyday conversation," Queen said, explaining that subjects can be approa to react.

"It has the power to move people to action. We saw that in the '60s in terms of the Civil Rights movement," she said.

It's something, Queen said, that society also is seeing today.

"I just think it will be fun. It's not going to be dry. I think it's going to be a riot, and I hope people come out to see," she said.

Mark Pedelty, professor of communication studies and an affiliate professor of anthropology at the University of Minnesota, will be part of a panel, "The Pulse: Mu Downtown Artery, 254 Linden St., and do a presentation on his book, "Ecomusicology," at 5:30 p.m. at Old Firehouse Books. 232 Walnut St.

"I think as academics, we don't think of ourselves as writers, but that's what we do," Pedelty said.

Combining his two lifelong interests, Pedelty studies musicians and musical activists' roles regarding environmental issues, sustainability and soundscapes.

"In movements, music and musicians can be catalysts to bring people together," Pedelty said.

Part of his talk will cover his research on musical activist Dana Lyons.

"He really just raised awareness but did it in a creative way that didn't polarize and turn people off," Pedelty said. This sort of music is something that Pedelty said is becoming a genre in its own right.

"It's starting to get where you can say with straight face, that's environmental music," he said.

Pedelty writes about only one part of how music can affect society and is looking forward to being part of the bigger discussion.

"I think that's what's fun about being around authors and people who write about music. It's a whole world unto itself," he said.

The library district will continue to choose themes for the book festival based on the interests of the community, Auman said.

Last year for the inaugural event, the topics revolved around brewing, including craft beer, tea and coffee.

"We really wanted to make sure we're focused on areas of the community that people were already interested in," Auman said.

Kim Gordon's memoir "Girl in a Band" starts with the end. A concert in Bra that would mark the end of her 30-year career as the bassist and singer for the experimental rock band Sonic Youth. And the end of her 27-year marriage to band mate Thurston Moore.

"Maybe that was the part (of the story) that was most in people's mind so was kind of good to get it over with," said Gordon, 64, from her home in Lo Angeles. "I guess I usually plunge into things that make me nervous, you know, kind of without thinking. It's just easier if you just do it. And in the same way, when I'm on stage sometimes I feel most relaxed. I don't know it's a weird thing."


Gordon started out her career as a visual artist in New York and Los Angeles, but found herself drawn into music. However, she said she always felt like a "lowercase rockstar."

"When we started playing music it was kind of in the post-punk era which was sort of anti-rockstar," she said. "I mean, I would have to say Sonic Youth is a big cult band. We weren't a mainstream band and that's -- mainstream bands -- to me, implies rockstar. Capital R."

But being a rockstar -- capital R or not -- allowed Gordon the opportunity to do other things. Over the years, she's added "actor" and "fashion designer" to her list of creative outlets -- none of which came from any kind of plan.

"Yeah, I guess I do kind of wait for inspiration to strike," she said. "If I'm not feeling it in music then I'll go to my studio. But I try to kind of just move to another medium -- maybe that will inspire me. But I'm not a 9-to-5, in-my-studio kind of person. I'm much more of a restless worker."

Her most recent musical effort was born out of that same spirit.

While working with producer Justin Raisen on another project, Gordon

and he started sending tracks back and forth. The result was the song "Murdered Out," inspired by the L.A. trend of blacking out identifying markers on a car.

Gordon said the process was unlike anything she'd done before and it inspired her to do something else she's never done: A solo record.

When asked if she'd begun writing for that record though, Gordon said she hasn't. Instead, she's waiting for that aforementioned inspiration. Meanwhil she's also working with guitarist Bill Nace on their experimental duo Body/Head, and on a fashion line for & Other Stories. The solo project will



FoCo Book Fest features world-famous musicians, authors

Frank Zappa famously said that writing about music is like dancing about architecture, or maybe it was Theolonius monk. Or even Steve Martin.

No matter who said it, they did not do much to dissuade the speakers at the FoCo Book Fest this Saturday.

World famous musicians, authors attend Book Fest in Old Town

Nearly 50 speakers—including some world famous musicians attended panels, gave book talks, led workshops and signed autographs at event centers throughout Old Town in tune with the Book Fest's theme Writings and Riffs.

At the Downtown Artery and Block One Events, the event featured authors and world famous musicians who delved deep into their recent works before coming together to share their biggest influences.

The first featured speaker of the day was Steve Knopper, author of "MJ: The Genius Michael Jackson," the self-proclaimed definitive biography of the king of pop.

Knopper, a prolific music journalist and contributing editor of the Rolling Stone, interviewed over 400 people involved in Jackson's career to evidence the true brilliance in the often-misunderstood star.

In the Jackson 5 days, Michael managed to stand out despite the team of Motown songwriters and arrangers doing all the heavy lifting.

Another speaker was Craig Werner, cultural historian and member of the Nominating Committee of the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame. His book "For What it's Worth: A New History of the Sixties" offers exactly what it says in the title —an unexpected look at the musical and political forces at work in the hippie generation.

"Gospel songs are the songs of hope," Werner said quoting Mahalia Jackson. "When you sing them you are delivered of your burden. You have a feeling that there is a cure for what's wrong."

All `60s music is derivative of the gospel, rhythm and blues of African-American culture argues Werner, and with it comes this common sentiment of freedom, the cure for what is wrong. But everyone had a different meaning of freedom.

Using excerpts from the book, Werner broke down a lot of misconceptions about the `60s, such as that Martin Luther King Jr. was the sole harbinger of the civil rights movement or that John F. Kennedy was the progressive saint he is thought of today.


In between these arguments, Werner played a collection of iconic `60s anthems like "We Gotta Get Out Of This Place" by The Animals.

Headlining the Book Fest was Loudon Wainwright III, veteran folk songwriter-turned-author with pieces covered by Johnny Cash and a Grammy to boot.

He told a story from his book about his childhood friend Liza Minnelli, daughter of Judy Garland. Wainwright would chauffeur Minnelli around in a toy convertible as the future Oscar winner waved at invisible crowds of paparazzi.

Wainwright later put this memory to song with "Liza," which he performed for the Book Fest crowd.

In the starkest possible contrast to Wainwright came the next headliner, Kim Gordon, co-founder of the iconic `80s post-punk rock band Sonic Youth. Rather than expound on herself in her memoir "Girl in a Band"—an act she admittedly does not enjoy—Gordon instead explained the philosophy underpinning much of her art.

"We dance and play and forget for a moment that we're all existentially alone," Gordon said. "Get me out of the 9-5 and onto the weekend."



Aside from being a musician and author,

Innovation Summary

The "FoCo Book Fest" is an event celebrating literary themes that resonate with the community and showcase the cultural heritage and economic development of the region. The inaugural book fest theme, "Brewin' Up Books," highlighted the unique intersection of northern Colorado's strong craft brewing culture and our diverse literary arts.

Problem Statement

There was an opportunity to create a venue for regionally/nationally known authors to speak to our community about unique topics, meet with festival attendees, provide literary programs and workshops and focus attention on libraries, books, and the literary arts in Fort Collins. A collaboration among public and academic libraries, the city, and local businesses could engage the community in unexpected ways while helping the library district reach new audiences.



Innovation

We served as the lead producer of the "Book Fest" as an independent community-wide program, collaborating with the City of Fort Collins, Colorado State University, nonprofit and for-profit businesses to create the area's first large book festival. By aligning our annual festival themes around the city's Economic Development Clusters, we drew the business and entrepreneurial community into the library community to support books and authors, as well as cultural, social and economic priorities.

Progress

The "FoCo Book Fest" was successful in providing a platform for libraries, business and nonprofit entities to engage the community in celebration of our local creative industries while drawing attention to the significance of libraries.

Additionally, the event succeeded in supporting key library district initiatives outlined in our Strategic Plan

including building community engagement, attracting target audiences, establishing partnerships and branding the library district as a center for continuous learning.
