For our continuing discussion on Output and Outcomes, I have attached a spreadsheet (which I shared briefly at the February 8<sup>th</sup> board meeting) on specific outputs. There are four outputs in this attached spreadsheet, derived from the Colorado State Library's Library Research
Service: https://www.lrs.org/data-tools/public-libraries/annual-statistics/

- ✓ Total Circulation for each year
- ✓ Visits per capita
- ✓ Circulation per capita
- ✓ Registration as a % of population

The years covered are 2015 through 2019, and include many libraries along the Front Range. If it is a Larimer County Library, the name of the Library is in red. You will notice there are shades of green and red in the columns. 2015 is the base year, and in each succeeding year, if the output increased, I shaded the cell green. If the output decreased, I shaded the cell red. If there was no change, the shade of the cell remained white.

As a whole, we can always do a better job establishing key performance indicators (such as the attached outputs) to see if the outcomes we hope to achieve are actually happening. One of the drivers to hire a Programming and Events coordinator is to establish outcomes that align with what our community wishes to achieve and offer programs and events to have these outcomes come to fruition. Our library district, along with most public libraries, believe that aligning the outcomes of the library to the outcomes of the community is the best direction.

Some libraries are now taking a different approach. The Douglas County Library, southeast of Denver, is working on changing their performance indicators by targeting customer outcomes rather than societal or community outcomes, because their library leadership does not feel comfortable connecting societal-level linkages yet. They plan to measure customer loyalty and satisfaction and customer market share. One of the tools they plan to use is the Net Promoter score, developed by OrangeBoy, the data analytics company the library district also uses.

The attached outputs can lead one to assume possible outcomes for our library district. As Joe Wise mentioned at the last board meeting, circulation of physical materials is down 40% from near or around 2010-2012 years. Even though the circulation of physical materials is down significantly, our total circulation is relatively steady, which indicates our users appreciate and use downloadable items from the convenience of his/her own home or place of work. If we do not need as many physical items, we can re-purpose space for users to offer programs, services and collaborative spaces our users desire, which help move our community forward. While our physical circulation is down 40%, our visits been reduced from 1,036.817 to 997,353 visits, or a 3.8% decline from 2015-2019. Due in increases in population in our district, the per capita visits in 2015 of 5.44 visits has been reduced to 4.88 visits per capita in 2019, which is down approximately 10%. We can share people are using the library more for other programs and services rather than circulating physical materials. This is further confirmed as library card registration as a percentage of total population has held steady at 80%

Like all of you, library leadership is interested in finding ways to use our outputs to better measure the outcomes we are seeking. There are many other methods such as surveys, evaluation forms, focus groups, comments, city and county statistics, school metrics we can use to determine if the outcomes we hope to achieve are being realized. Combined with outputs, we hopefully get a clearer picture if our services are accomplishing what we want them to.
